Summary of incidents in Burbage this month

Crime figures for this month are much improved on October with a reduction in residential burglary and vehicle theft. Please continue to be vigilant around suspicious activity in your area. Please report suspicious activity to 101 non-emergency or 999 emergency. If you can get a good description or a vehicle registration, that would be fantastic. We have continued to work with local schools around bullying and online incidents. The current circumstances can affect everyone including school children. We have spoken to many children about bullying and online safety to try and keep them safe online. We not only try to offer support to victims but also complete home visits and deal with suspects to ensure their behaviour does not continue. I have been working with local schools around residential complaints of parking/obstruction/speeding in Burbage. We are communicating with partner agencies to see what permanent solutions can be put in place to support concerns. The MVAS box has been up on Coventry Road and we are hoping to have the speed gun out and about over the coming weeks. You may have also noticed the speed van on Rugby Road this month.
