Summary of incidents in Burbage this month

We have seen a couple of incidents near the start of May of vehicle theft and theft from vehicle. These incidents happened over a couple of days and as a result, targeted patrols were completed in the area. No further incidents were reported until a theft of a VRM plate at the end of May. Incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour involving groups of youths including some criminal damage. These events are ongoing and we are in the process of identifying those involved.

Patrols and crime prevention support. We have visited residents to support with crime prevention advice and products such as key wallets and cactus spikes. Our patrols are also focused around what concerns our residents raise and areas that have been targeted for crime.

We continue to work ongoing around complaints of bad parking, bullying, Anti-Social Behaviour and scams.

We have been out with the speed gun but only managed to attend Rugby Road (from M69 to Hinckley 40Mph). Several drivers were caught speeding and are being dealt with. We will be going out again very soon to visit locations raised as concerns by Burbage residents.

You said – Vehicle crime (theft from or theft of)

We did – Targeted patrols were completed following a Speight of vehicle crime over two nights where two vehicles were taken and two vehicles had items taken. There were no further reports until the end of the month when a pair of registration plates were taken. We continue to raise awareness around not leaving anything in your vehicle and ensure it is locked and secure at all times. Patrols continue where stop searches are completed. Please call 101 or 999 immediately if you see any suspicious activity. Information such as registration plate details, descriptions and direction of travel really help attending officers.

You said – *Anti-Social Behaviour*

We did – We have visited local Schools to speak with children around Bullying and Anti-Social Behaviour. We hope to complete more of these activities over the coming months. We have also completed targeted patrols of parks in the area at key times. When incidents do occur, we rely on the support and knowledge of local residents to help us identify those involved so that we can challenge the behaviour. We have completed home visits to raise awareness around community concerns with parents of the youths involved, hopefully parents can support with preventing future issues.

You said – Road Safety Issues

We did – We have visited Sketchley Primary and Burbage Juniors School to monitor parking issues, speak with residents and challenge drivers. We also started our speed gun event which was unfortunately cut short. We managed some time on the Rugby Road from the M69 towards Hinckley. Several drivers were caught travelling between 47-49Mph in a 40Mph zone. We have also traced vehicle owners to discuss concerns raised by residents around “problem vehicles”. We discussed these concerns with vehicle keepers and advised. We try to continually engage with local residents, Schools and businesses to resolve issues but also residents/drivers as everyone ultimately needs to take responsibility for their own actions, whether that be speed, parking or manner of driving.
