Summary of incidents in Burbage this month

We have seen an increase this month in criminal activity around thefts and attempt thefts of vehicles. Targeted vehicles tend to be high value or high performance vehicles. Currently criminals are typically gaining access to the back of properties to get keys. Access is usually gained by smashing windows or breaking locks on patio doors. Please take a look at the link for security advice. There is generally an increase in criminal activity at this time of year but please try to check some basic security measures such as locking doors and windows, leaving some lights on, setting alarms and using steering locks.

We are also currently dealing with reports of Anti-social behaviour which can link in with bullying. We are working with local schools and have some visits planned in. Being bullied can have a massive impact on people of all ages. We are trying to address concerns raised and ask for parents to support with this.
