I have worked in policing for nearly 27 years – spending much of my time as a frontline officer in both neighbourhood policing and response roles, mainly in the Loughborough area.

I also spent eight years in the roads traffic team and most recently spent the last year coordinating the delivery of officer driver and skills training across four regional police forces. I have really enjoyed my first few weeks and I am building on the great work of Emma and the rest of the team.

*We attended Coventry Road, Featherston Drive, Sapcote Road and Herald way with community speed watch to monitor speeding at these locations.

*I have spoken and visited residents who have raised concerns around home or vehicle security. Crime figures are currently very good, but we ask residents to remain vigilant and ensure your property is secured, to make it as difficult as possible for criminals. We continue with our targeted patrols and work to identify those involved in criminality. Please continue to pass on any information you may have if you suspect someone as being involved in criminal activity.

*We have also continued to address reports of Anti-social behaviour. This action has included warning letters, home visits and working with partner agencies such as HBBC.
