

TRAFFIC ISSUES WORKING PARTY

1. **To receive apologies for absence**

2. **To confirm the minutes of the meeting held on 26th February.**

The minutes were accepted as correct.

3. **Matters arising (not included elsewhere on the agenda)**

4. **Road Safety**

Concerns were discussed about the return to speed issues which is apparent since the Covid-19 lockdown. Mr Payne explained how the speeds along Coventry Road are of great concern.

PCSO Stretton to investigate if speed check are now possible. If they are possible Cllrs Mayne & Walker and Mr Payne offered to assist if needed.

Cllr Williams confirmed that Leicestershire County Council have confirm that they own the speed signs along Lutterworth Road and they will be removed to see if repairs are possible. Cllr Williams to monitor to ensure they are returned.

Discussion was held on how best to raise the danger of speed in the village. The video prepared for Sharnford to raise their own issues of traffic through Sharnford was watched for ideas.

5. **Lutterworth Road recent calming measures**

Following discussion of the consultation information it was agreed that the following points would in included in our response to the consultation.

- The fact that the consultation is retrospective
- Supportive in Principle
- Concern that the location of the kerb build-out are not adequately signposted
- Lack of Cycle provision

- Comparisons with Sapcote installation

A response to this effect will be prepared and sent.

6. **MVAS data update.**

PCSO Stretton will ask if the MVAS equipment can be installed again and if so arrange an early installation. Confirmed is required as to how to request cost estimates for new lamppost locations for the MVAS box. Foresters Road was flagged as an area of particular concern.

Raw data from the MVAS box to be shared with Mr Payne for analysis.

7. **Issues raised by parishioners.**

No further updates at this time.

8. **Traffic Volumes**

Although no progress had been made on traffic volumes it was re-confirmed this is an important area of knowledge for protecting Burbage from Development issues.

9. **Leicester County Council Traffic Policy.**

A discussion of the LCC strategic traffic plan was discussed and a draft response to the consultation agreed by the group.

Discuss was held on the benefit of additional cycleways and how they could be useful for school journeys.
