Summary of incidents in Burbage this month

It has been another overall a good month for crime figures in Burbage. Here is a summary of incidents for the month.

- Two tow chains stolen from a tractor on Fletcher road.
- Several incidents of Anti-Social Behaviour around Britannia Fields, Hinckley Road Park and Rugby Road Park.
- Continued concerns raised around scams via phone, Email and Text message.
- Several vehicles seized following patrols due to issues such as no tax, insurance, MOT or licence.

#YouSaidWeDid

You said – Anti-Social Behaviour

We did – Following recent reports of ASB in the village, we have investigated, identified and dealt with many of those involved. As you may have seen from our previous Neighbourhood Link message, this includes speaking to Schools, parents, children and completing home visits. Outcomes included educational talks, warning letters and actions taken by the parents who have been very supportive. We are also continuing our targeted patrols in areas raised as concerns by residents. We have invested a lot of time and resource into challenging this type of behaviour in the Village.

You said – Road Safety <https://leicestershirehighways.org.uk/>

We did – We have continued to work with Schools and challenge dangerous drivers in a variety of ways. One example is the work we completed with Sketchley Primary School which was sent out to parents of children attending the School. You can see this message on the Neighbourhood Link message. We have also been out with the speed gun as part of Community Speed Watch. We visited many locations to monitor speeds and raise awareness. The MVAS box has also been up on 2 available sites on Sapcote road following residents' concerns. Letters have also been sent to several motorists reminding them to park and drive in a responsible manner around the village.

You said – Vehicle Crime (theft of or theft from)

We did – This month has seen no car thefts or theft from vehicles. There has been one incident where two tow chains were taken from a tractor. Vehicle crime has historically been a concern in Burbage so residents are still mindful of the potential concerns. We complete ongoing active patrols to look out for suspicious activity. You may see our posts around seized vehicles and stop searches. We also continue to support residents with crime prevention such as car key wallets and home visits.
